After much deliberation, we've decided to turn our back lawn into a Drive-In Theater!!

One of the most prevalent phrases in entertainment is, "the show must go on". Over the past few months, members of Community Players have brainstormed ways to make that happen, since COVID19 caused us to cancel multiple productions this year.

The Production Committee was tasked with finding performance options that feature a small cast size, minimal technical requirements, and allow for social distancing between actors. As always, safety is our number one priority during this time for our cast, crews, and audience members.

Beginning in September, Players will hold outdoor readers theater performances and concerts at their location, 5109 Nutters Cross Road, in Salisbury. These performances will be a drive-in style, with audiences enjoying the show from the comfort and safety of their vehicle. Each performance will be broadcast via FM Transmitter directly to your car radio!

The following shows are recommended for outdoor readers theater performances at the Community Players facility: *Love, Loss, and What I Wore*, *Love Letters*, *Hate Mail*, and a concert to be organized by Rusty Mumford and Darrell Mullins

A schedule with tentative dates, times, and rain dates for each show is attached. Schedule is subject to change or be rearranged based on weather, casting decisions, ability to obtain performance rights, and other unforeseen factors.

Since Covid-19 threw a curve ball in our original season plans, Community Players has put together a collection of outdoor performances to be held at our 5109 Nutters Cross Road location!

These performances will be held in a drive-in style with audiences enjoying the show from the comfort and safety of their vehicle. Each performance will be broadcast via FM Transmitter directly to your car radio!



Kel is a lifelong fan of theater, especially musicals. Kel was encouraged to get on stage by his friend and former outstanding Player, Mary Ann Dunn. When he filled out his first audition form, for the 1996 production of *Guys and Dolls*, he answered the acting experience question with “President of Wicomico County Board of Education, 11 years.” Director Chris Harris, not knowing what to do with an outsized rookie, invented the role of Big Jule’s body-guard. Friends and family all told him how happy he looked to be up there. He was delighted when his next director, Rusty Mumford, described him as a “Players Regular”. Since then, he has appeared in over twenty shows. He was encouraged to try directing by his friends Jack Lynch and Cindy Gore. Cindy served as assistant director for his first direction gig, *You Can’t Take It with You*, and played lead roles for Kel in *The Hollow* and *Doubt*.

Kel’s last appearance on stage was our last show, when he played Cheswick in *One Flew Over the Cuckoo’s Nest*. He has directed seven shows, the last being *The Drowsy Chaperone*, in 2019. He was scheduled to direct *Kiss Me Kate*, which was cancelled this June due to the pandemic.

Kel’s partner in life and in theater, Debby, has never appeared on stage, but has been set decorator and props and furniture getter for many shows. Thanks, Deb, for the support, forbearance, and love.

A retired pulmonologist, Kel wants to remind everyone that Covid 19 is not likely to magically disappear, and that until we get a vaccine, effective anti-viral treatment, or both, we need to keep up with the social distancing and masks. The better our society is at containing the virus, the sooner we get to do live indoor theater.



Dowd), *Social Security* (David Kahn), and *Christmas Carol* (Scrooge/Dickens). He has also had the privilege of playing the same role multiple times ... Schroeder in *You’re a Good Man, Charlie Brown* twice, one of Vernon’s alter egos in *They’re Playing Our Song* twice, *Sound of Music* ensemble twice, and *Godspell* ensemble three times.

Rusty’s love for theatre is a family affair. His wife, Becky, has been a Players’ member for almost as long as he, serving on the Board, performing on stage, and taking backstage responsibilities. Both of his sons have been seen on stage and behind the scenes and his oldest granddaughter has two stage appearances to her credit.

Rusty is a retired educator. He taught French, Spanish, and Drama in Somerset County for 30 years. He then worked as an MSP grant administrator for Worcester County Public Schools for eight years. He is currently the president of the Maryland Foreign Language Association (MFLA), which is dedicated to the support and growth of world language education in Maryland and across the country.
