Criteria for Consideration:

- 1. At least 60 years of age and/or posthumous
- 2. At least 25 years of service (service as defined below)
 - a. Service: Something other than just showing up: (2 of 3)
 - A1 acting
 - A2 directing/stage crew/tech
 - A3 administrative board, committee, something!
 - b. <u>Special circumstances</u>: on case by case basis (sudden death / missed the timeline by a narrow margin but is felt deserving by board vote / someone who gets to Broadway)
- 3. Posthumous a second award given the following evening to a past member who is gone. Consideration must be evaluated by the committee but after 2 years of waiting.

Congratulations, Treston!




THEATRE TEASERS
