#### PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE

Current By-Law #6:

No alcoholic beverages shall be consumed by any member or production participant during meetings, rehearsals, or productions either at the Nutters Cross Road facility or in an assigned auditorium.

Proposed Change to By-Law #6:

No alcoholic beverages shall be consumed during meetings or rehearsals either at the Community Players Theater facility or in an assigned facility. Alcoholic beverages shall not be consumed by actors or production crew actively performing duties during a performance at the Community Players Theater facility or in an assigned facility.

The vote on this by-laws change will take place at the December meeting.



## A TALE OF THREE ANNIES

Everyone at players is excited about our first production of the season, *Annie*, which will be at Wi-Hi on Friday November 7 and Saturday, November 8 at 7:30 PM, and Saturday, November 8 and Sunday, November 9 AT 2pm.

Director Sherri Hynes was glad to see that the two little girls who shared the role of Annie in 1990 auditioned for adult roles in this production. She was also happy but not surprised to have numerous girls try out for the lead role. She says "Casting decisions are always hard, but I think everyone will love Anna, now known as Annie at school, playing the role. She has great stage presence and learns quickly."

Here is the bio supplied by Anna's Mom:

ANNA MARIE PERKOWSKI (Annie) is thrilled to make her Community Players debut! This Mardela Middle Schooler can usually be found rocking out with AMP Bands, singing her heart out with the Salisbury Children's Choir, or performing with her school's Drama Club. Though shy and soft-spoken offstage, she comes alive the moment the lights hit—a spark first lit by her then 5th-grade teachers, who convinced her to try a talent show. After debuting as a Mersister in *The Little Mermaid Jr.* at MMHS, Anna is beyond grateful for this chance to chase her "Tomorrow."

Now for those other two Annies, Kate Allen Dyer and Katie Simms Parsons, who shared the role 25 years ago.

Kate plays Grace, the sophisticated assistant of Daddy Warbucks. She provided an update from her *Annie* days.

I made my Community Players debut in *The Music Man* in 1999. In 2000, I Annie for two shows and. July in the other two. I went on to be in *The Wizard of Oz, Little Women, How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying, Footloose*, and *Anything Goes* with Players. I also choreographed their 2007 production of *High School Musical*. I also was very involved with the Eastern Shore Ballet Theatre for twelve years, performing with their company from 1996-2008. I then went to college at William and Mary and got a master's degree from Georgetown University in 2014. Since then, I have been working in independent education. I worked at the Sayre School in Lexington, KY for four years, and I currently work in the English department at The Salisbury School.

I moved back to Salisbury in 2018 with my husband, Nelson, who is a dentist. We have three children: Whitt--8, Mary Violet--6, and Clara--3. I am so excited to be back with Players for the first time in 18 years! I am also thrilled by their new space. It significantly enhances rehearsals and is a beautiful small performance space. I look forward to being in more Players shows in the future, and I am excited for my children to be able to experience quality local theater.

As to the other Annie, Katie Simms Parsons., who will have to act really well as the mean, abusive Miss Hannigan. She will make us believe that she would like to step on the orphans' freckles. She gave us some info on the real Katie.

My program bio is: Katie Parsons first took the stage 25 years ago as Annie and is delighted to return, older, wiser, and far less wholesome! Favorite Players roles include Nancy (*Oliver!*), Sandra (*All Shook Up*), *Mary Poppins*, and Mary (*Jesus Christ Superstar*). Endless thanks to her husband and three kiddos for surviving Mrs. Hannigan!

My journey in musical theater began in 2000 when I stepped on stage as Annie in the Community Players production of **Annie**, under the same directorship as this show with Sherri Trader Hynes. That first role sparked a lifelong passion for musical theater that continues to shape my life today. I can't audition for a show without thinking of that first step onto the Wi-Hi stage, bucket in hand, with a mass of people in the audience supporting me.

My love for performance grew, where I enjoyed roles such as Aunt Eller in **Oklahoma!**, Liesl in **The Sound of Music**, and Peter Pan in **Peter Pan** in my high school's productions. College offered further opportunities with Community Players, where I had the pleasure of working under the guidance of talented directors like Sherri Trader Hynes, Lisa Robbins, and Ken Johnson.

I attribute my musical foundation to my upbringing at Christ Methodist Church, where I was immersed in music from a young age. With a mother who plays the organ and piano and serves as choir director, music was always at the heart of my home and community. Mom, Susan Robinson, will be in the orchestra, and Dad, Tom Robinson, who is usually behind the scenes in the sound booth, will be on stage in a wheelchair, playing President Roosevelt.

As an adult, I married my high school sweetheart, and together we have three children attending The Salisbury School, our alma mater. I had the honor of conducting The Salisbury School's upper school choral program before transitioning into my current role as Dean of Students.

Returning to Community Players has been a full-circle experience. From rehearsing in the old "chicken house" in 2000 to practicing on the beautiful stage at Nutters Cross Road today, I have cherished every moment. While my roles have matured in age, the magic of performing in shows that touch hearts and leave lasting impressions remains unchanged.

I am deeply grateful to the visionary leadership and generous donors who have supported Community Players over the years. The opportunities, memories, and stages they've provided have shaped my life in countless ways. I look forward to witnessing their continued growth in bringing local theater to our community and hope you will consider supporting their capital campaign to keep this vibrant tradition thriving.

There is one other orphan update. Director Sherri reminds us that Shelby {Traum} Trenary, who played orphan Kate and was also in the Eastern Shore Ballet for years is now a professional dance instructor and adjunct faculty member At Salisbury University. She has two children and is excited to teach her daughter ballet!
